Call to Order

- Dr. Michael Dent called the meeting to order at 12:00 P.M.

Public Comments

- There were no public comments.

Approval of July 17, 2018 Minutes (See attached.)

- Brad Calhoun made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 17, 2018 meeting. The motion was seconded by Odis Reese. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Business:

Financial Information – Teresa Giles (See attached.)

- The Revenue and Expense Summary, Fee Income, Fee History and Family Planning reports were reviewed for July 1, 2018 through October 31, 2018.

Public Health Updates – William R. Grow, MD, FACP (See attached.)

- Dr. Grow discussed in detail the Board of Health Liability update.

Nurse Manager’s Report – Mary Anne Sturdevan (See attached.)

- Ms. Sturdevan announced that a number of flu vaccines were administered between September and November of 2018. A total of 76 high dose and 300 VFC and private stock vaccines were administered. Fifteen vaccines were reserved for uninsured/underinsured adults who care for vulnerable populations. The target populations for those reserved are foster parents, daycare workers, and behavioral health employees or consumers. All health department staff have been vaccinated. This year, a minimal amount of flu vaccines was given at the elementary, middle and high schools.
- Ms. Sturdevan informed the Board that the health department was closed for three days during the Hurricane Michael event. Vaccines were monitored daily; however, there was water leaking from the roof in certain areas. The county manager is working with the health department to take care of the repairs. The alarm system, which was not connected to the generator during the storm, has now been connected and is working properly with a back-up battery.

- Ms. Sturdevan attended a lunch and learn at First Baptist Church to discuss the Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (BCCP) and she will also visit Ashburn Primary Care to provide information to patients about BCCP screenings to qualified clients.

Environmental Health Update – Lee Cumbee (See attached.)

- Mr. Cumbee provided the inspection reports for May 18, 2018 - November 9, 2018, noting that calls or visits were made to each restaurant during Hurricane Michael as they reopened after the hurricane.
- An article was placed in the newspaper in August of 2018 about getting well water tested. Many took advantage of that process.
- Chris Calhoun asked the Board for guidance regarding RIP's restaurant and requested permission to discuss the matter with the county attorney. The Board agreed that the attorney be contacted.
